- 3. You shall not take the Name of the Lord your God in vain.
- 4. Remember the Sabbath day and keep it holy.
- 5. Honor your father and your mother.
- 6. You shall not murder.
- 7. You shall not commit adultery.
- 8. You shall not steal.
- 9. You shall not bear false witness against your neighbor.
- 10. You shall not covet.



Today's Gospel Lesson

"Gospel" means "good news." The four books in the New Testament tell the story of Jesus' life, which we call the Gospels. They include Matthew, Mark, Luke, and John.

Remain Standing

The Holy Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Saint John.

Glory to you, Lord Christ.

John 1:1-18 (International Children's Bible)

Before the world began, there was the Word. The Word was with God, and the Word was God. 2 He was with God in the beginning. 3 All things were made through him. Nothing was made without him. 4 In him there was life. That life was light for the people of the world. 5 The Light shines in the darkness. And the darkness has not overpowered the Light. 6 There was a man named John[c] who was sent by God. 7 He came to tell people about the Light. Through him all people could hear about the Light and believe. 8 John was not the Light, but he came to tell people about the Light. 9 The true Light was coming into the world. The true Light gives light to all. 10 The Word was in the world. The world was made through him, but the world did not know him. 11 He came to the world that was his own. But his own people did not accept him. 12 But some people did accept him. They believed in him. To them he gave the right to become children of God. 13 They did not become his children in the human way. They were not born because of the desire or wish of some man. They were born of God. 14 The Word became a man and lived among us. We saw his glory—the glory that belongs to the only Son of the Father. The Word was full of grace and truth. 15 John told about him. He said, "This is the One I was talking about. I said, 'The One who comes after me is greater than I am. He was living before me." 16 The Word was full of grace and truth. From him we all received more and more blessings. 17 The law was given through Moses, but grace and truth came through Jesus Christ. 18 No man has ever seen God. But God the only Son is very close to the Father. And the Son has shown us what God is like.

The Apostles Creed

A creed is a statement of faith. The purpose of the creeds is to declare and safeguard for all generations essential truths about God, the Church, and the world, as revealed in Holy Scripture.

Remain Standing

He suffered under Pontius Pilate. was crucified, died, and was buried. He descended to the dead. On the third day he rose again. He ascended into heaven. and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again to judge the living and the dead. I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints. the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body. and the life everlasting. Amen.



The Lord's Prayer

You should learn the Lord's Prayer because Jesus taught it to his disciples as both a practice and pattern for prayer to God the Father. We should pray the Lord's Prayer regularly because it teaches us to pray as Jesus commanded and to desire what his Father wills.

Sit

Fold Your Hands & Bow Your Head

Our Father, who art in heaven, Hallowed be thy Name, Thy kingdom come, thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread. And forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us. And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. For thine is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory, for ever and ever. Amen.


